Style Sheet: Springer Briefs in ESDP

1. The editors must submit the volume in a copy-ready electronic form. AFES-PRESS requires all final manuscripts by Email written or converted and stored in **Word 2007, Word 2003**. If you use another software please convert the text into **Word 2003**
2. You should send one **draft** and the **final manuscript by Email** to the **series editor**:
 - Hans Günter Brauch (brauch@onlinehome.de or afes@afes-press.de)
3. The total length of the book manuscript should not be longer than 70.000 words
4. The **outline of the pages** follows the adapted Springer style for this book series.
5. **Division of the Book**: Parts will be counted with Roman I, II III and chapters with Arabic numbers 1, 2, 3. A decimal system will apply for all chapters, e.g. chapter 11: 11.1., 11.2. (with up to *three categories* excluding the number of the chapter (1.1. to 9.9.)). The chapter will be added by the editor at the end, e.g. 11.1.3.4.
6. **Typographical treatment** of different parts of the text: emphasis (in *italics*)
7. **Abbreviation**: Please add a list of abbreviations used in your text (with the full meaning in English and [in the original language]).
8. Please number **all tables and figures** consecutively (.e.g. **table 1.1, 1.2, figure 1.1, 1.2**, etc.). The first number refers to the chapter number, e.g. chapter 1 with table/figure 1.
9. There will be **footnotes** on the bottom of the page and **no endnotes**. Please add here only the **full references of newspaper articles, grey literature, internet sources** etc. and do not include these again in the bibliography. For **bibliographic references** see the next page.
10. **Bibliography**: the bibliography will be at the end of the chapter. All literature titles will be referred to in the text (American quotation style, e.g.: Family name 1996a: 234). All references must be listed in an **alphabetical bibliography** at the end of the text. Titles by the same authors must be organised by publication date and those of the same author and year must be distinguished as a, b, c.
11. **Quotation Style**: Please fully implement the style on the next page. The editor cannot accept final chapters if the style is not standardised.
12. **British or American English spelling** will be implemented throughout the book. It is of utmost importance that the same version of English applies to all chapters in the same book.
13. The **final layout** will be made by the technical editor of **Springer publishers**.
14. All **chapters** with their final layout will be made available in **pdf-Format** for proofreading.
15. **Copyright law**: Each author is required to respect the international copyright laws, especially those of Germany and of the US. In case of violation the editors and authors will bear all legal obligations. If you use photos, tables and figures from other publications full reference must be given and permission must be sought by **the author for the editor**. A complete list all permissions must be forwarded to the **editor** of the book series with submission of the final manuscript.
16. Please submit all chapters as a **single-spaced manuscript** in 12 point. Please use different files for: Text, b. bibliography, c. list of abbreviations, d. list of tables and figures (count them as **x.1, x.2**).
17. **On the author**. Each author should submit a brief biography with major publications of up to **100 words**, Please follow the model Hexagon Book Series:
18. Sample pages for all **books in the Hexagon Series of Springer** (see **the model pages of volume 1**) may be downloaded at: http://www.afes-press.de/html/bk_book_of_year.html; especially of: the **text, tables, figures, abbreviations, bibliography and index**. Please closely follow this style.
19. Please follow the guidelines of the publisher that apply for Springer Briefs
20. Each text must have an abstract, up to 10 keywords and the brief biography that must be introduced by a footnote behind the name on the first page of each chapter. The bibliography is at the end of the chapter.

Bibliographic References and Quotation Style

The American social science quotation style will apply for this book. All bibliographical references will be included in **one consolidated bibliography** at the end of the book. Consistency is needed!!

1. Book of one author:

Schlesinger, Arthur, Jr., 1965a: *A Thousand Days* (Boston: Houghton Mifflin). *Quotation in the text only please not in the bibliography:* (Schlesinger 1995a: 10). [10 refers to page 10 in this book]

2. Book of two, three or more authors:

Proger, Samuel; Williams, Greer, 1974: *A Career in Primary Care* (Cambridge, Mass.: Ballinger). *Quotation in the text:* (Proger/Williams 1974: 20).

3. Book of one or more editors:

Schurr, Sam (Ed.), 1972: *Energy, Economic Growth, and the Environment* (Baltimore: Johns Hopkins Press). *Quotation in the text:* (Schurr 1972).

4. Chapter of one author in an edited book:

Musgrave, Richard, 1974: "On Social Goods and Social Bads", in: Morris, Richard (Ed.): *The Corporate Society* (New York: Macmillan): 251-280. *Quotation:* (Musgrave 1974: 276).

5. Article in a journal:

Wildavsky, Aaron, 1966: "The Political Economy of Efficiency", in: *Public Administration*, 26,1 (Spring): 313-16 [26 refers to volume, to issue/No. 1]. *Quotation:* (Wildavsky 1966: 315).

6. Unpublished article or book:

Fishburn Peter, 1972: "Lexicographic Orders", August (unpublished). *Quotation:* (Fishburn 1972: 4).

7. Mimeographed contribution:

Herman, Richard, 1970: „Procedures for the Identification of Foreign Policy Events“, Princeton University (Mimeo). *Quotation:* (Herman 1970: 21).

8. Conference paper:

Henny van der Graaf, 1991c: „Military Technology“, Paper for the 7th International AFES-PRESS Conference, Mosbach, FRG, 14-27 October. *Quotation:* (V.d. Graaf 1991c: 15).

9. Dissertation:

Caldwell, Theodore, 1977: „The International Monetary System“ (Ph.D. dissertation, University of Chicago, Department or Institute). *Quotation:* (Caldwell 1977: 315).

10. Institutional author or editor:

Energy Administration (ERDA), 1975: *A National Plan*, ERDA-48, Vol. 2 (Washington, D.C.: Government Printing Office). *Quotation:* (ERDA 1975: 31).

11. Book in press: *Quotation:* (Wingo 1966: 315).

Wingo, Lars (Ed.): *Cities and the Quality of Life* (Baltimore: Johns Hopkins Press, i.p.).

12. Article in print: *Quotation:* (Braunwald 1966: 315).

13. Braunwald, Edgar: „Coronary-Artery Surgery“, in: *The New England Journal of Medicine*, i.p..

For Articles without authors please use the following style. These references should be quoted in the footnotes and not included in the bibliography.

13. Articles or Pamphlets without an Author:

„Extending the Scope of Nursing Practice“, in: *Nursing Outlook*, 20,2 (January 1972): 48.

14. Newspaper Article:

„Results of the G-7 Summit“, in: *International Herald Tribune* (19 July 1991): 1,5 [This article starts on the front page and continues on page 5 of the paper].

15. Internet sources:

Please supply the **complete internet address (URL)**, the date and the page of the printout, because some references may be taken from the web when the reader tries to find them, e.g. the page for the Canterbury Conference: e.g., in: <http://www.essex.ac.uk/ecpr/genconf/panels/s16.htm> (3 May 2004): 2 of 5.
